Why does the library need to hold a vote?

Libraries are FREE to use, but not free to operate. The cost of ebooks and digital materials is much higher for libraries than for regular customers. The rising cost of medical insurance, retirement, and New York State's mandated minimum wage increases have greatly impacted our operating budget.

How is the Howland Public Library funded?

The library is funded by a variety of resources. The main source of funding comes from the taxpayers of the Beacon City School District through an annual budget vote. The remainder of the operating fund comes from grants and donations.

 - Additional library clerks and pages to meet increased usage
 - Adult services/community engagement & technology library assistant

Didn't you just go out for a vote?

The Howland Public Library will be able to continue to provide our residents with quality services. Our digital collection will continue to grow and we will be able to continue to offer tons of educational programs and helpful services.

What happens if the vote fails?

Unfortunately, the increasing costs of materials, wages, and library usage makes it impossible to continue to provide the same level of service with level funding. The Board will have to make hard decisions regarding what areas of services to cut in the result of a failed vote.

Where does the money go?

The money goes back to our community in the form of services and resources. Our staff is our biggest resource. They are the ones who connect our users with the resources and services that they need!

Budget Marrative

Local Public Funds: Seeking a 4 % increase in public funding to balance the mandatory NYS minimum wage increase, rising costs of materials and services, and expanded use of the library.

Contributions/Grants/Investments: The library receives small monetary donations throughout the year from private donors, the Friends of HPL, grants and income from investments.

Salaries and Wages: The cost of salaries as projected in the 2024-25 salary plan includes hiring additional staff to meet the increased use of the library and New York States' required increase to the minimum wage rate.

Health Insurance & Retirement: The rising cost of health insurance and NYS Retirement system is a challenging, as a result the library is investigating means to reduce these cost for the future.

Library Materials: Print book budget stays level as other material lines are increased due to demand and Mid-Hudson Library System resource sharing guidelines. Increased use of electronic materials requires more digital buying. Hoopla streaming service use in 2023-34 has increased significantly.

Programs: The projected cost of providing educational, cultural, and recreational programs for patrons of all ages.

Building Operation and Maintenance: The building needs many improvements/upgrades.

General & Administrative: Includes a full annual audit, legal, and human resources consulting. We have increased funding for staff/board continuing education, technology, and communication.
